Massachusetts Seniors Need More to Get By

WBZ (Newsroom) -- A new study shows Massachusetts elders are getting less than half of what they need to get by.

The report, by the Gerontology Institute at UMass-Boston, shows elders in the Bay State need between 14-thousand and 28-thousand dollars just to cover their basic living costs.

But in reality, they get less than half of that from social security, which for some is their only source of income.

Laura Henze Russell is with the institute. She says those numbers can lead to some tough choices, such as choosing between prescription medications and basic living necessities.

She adds outside support and subsidies are essential in helping elders bridge the financial gap.
